# Summer Undergraduate Research Experiences (SURE) Program

BSW student Adriana Arias and Dr. Kyung-Mee Choi researched the SURE project entitled "Indigenous Perspective: Hope, Resilience, and Adaptation of Migrants and Refugees" in summer 2024.

#### Presentation

On October 26, 2024, Dr. Kyung-Mee Choi presented the proposal entitled "Religion and Spirituality in Korean American Social Work Education and Practice" in the 70<sup>th</sup> Annual

On November 15, 2024, Dr. Althia Gayle, Assistant Professor of Social Work and School Social Work Program Coordinator, and Dr. Laura Honegger, Associate Professor of Social Work, attended the American Society on Criminology conference in San Francisco, CA. Dr. Honegger gave a presentation entitled, "Analyzing Body Worn Camera Footage Using an Objective Instrument, " which focused on the assessment of police interactions with persons in mental health crisis before and after an 8-hour Introduction to Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) Training.

On November 14, 2024, Drs. Gayle and Honegger gave a poster presentation entitled, "A Status Update on U.S. Mental Health Courts." The presentation included results from their ongoing study of adult U.S. mental health courts. This research project aims to provide a current state of adult MHCs within the United States, particularly regarding program structure, participant eligibility criteria, referral, case processing, trauma-informed programming, available internal and external resources, and use of sanctions and incentives.

On April 4, 2025, Dr. Dan Knapp and Prof. Rachel Lagorio along with Prof. Heather McDonald and Prof. Courtney Pritchard of College of Nursing presented the proposal "Influence of Social Work and Nursing Interdisciplinary Collaboration Skills at the undergraduate level: A pilot investigation" at the Wisconsin Council on Social Work Education conference.

On April 5 & 6, 2025, Dr. Buster Ogbuagu presented the topic "Their Way or No Way: 'Whiteness' as Agent for Marginalizing and Silencing Minority Voices in Academic Research and Publication" as a Keynote Speaker in the 32<sup>nd</sup> Annual Midwest Conference on Literature, Language and Media (MCLLM) at Northern Illinois University, DeKalb. The 2025 Theme is "Trouble' – Confronting Bigotry in Higher Education and Academic Scholarship."









## BSW and MSW Students Internship

Fall Semester, BSW students spent approximately 1400 hours serving local community agencies through their generalist internships. MSW students spent approximately 6100 hours serving area community agencies through generalist and advanced generalist internships. And School Specialty MSW students spent approximately 5700 hours in area schools completing school social work internships. That equals more than 12,000 hours our social work students give to our communities.

### MSW Information Session

MSW virtual information sessions were held on Wednesdays, February 26 & April 30, 6 pm – 7 pm via Zoom. We shared interests, career goals, expectations, needs, etc. with prospective students seeking an advanced generalist concentration or a school social work concentration. We had a lot of positive and supportive interactions with students and shared helpful information about our unique MSW program, admissions, and financial aid.

Dr. Buster Ogbuagu and more than 20 BSW and MSW students attended NASW Social Work Advocacy Day on Wednesday, April 9, 2025 at Illinois State Capital Building, Springfield.

Student Presentation & Field Instructors Training were held via Zoom on Friday, April 11, 2025. Around 40 MSW students presented their field project. For the field instructor training, Ms. Jen Crazythunder, LCSW, and Ms. Tameron Keeffe, LCSW from Family Service Association of Greater Elgin, presented the topic "What is Community Mental Health" and BSW student Adriana Arias and Dr. Kyung-Mee Choi presented the topic "Indigenous Perspective: Hope, Resilience, and Adaptation of Migrants and Refugees."
